Sydney, Aug. 16—(UP)—Frances Langford, movie and radio singer said today that she was certain her husband, Jon Hall, would "never make a pass at anyone else" and that she was not the least disturbed by reports of the fight in which he was involved at the Hollywood home of Band Leader Tommy Dorsey.

"Even if he did make a pass at someone, it would not make any difference to me," she added. "We have a perfect understanding."

Miss Langford said she did not believe Dorsey's reported charge that Hall had been making passes at Pat Dane, who is Mrs. Dorsey, at a nightclub party which preceded the free-for-all fight in the Dorsey home about a week ago.

"Jon and I have been married seven years and we just adore each other," Miss Langford said.

MEDFORD TWINS IN NAVY SERVICE MEET IN HAWAII

A meeting between Medford twin brothers, Myrlyn and Melvin Scott, after a separation of two years, is described in a letter received recently by a friend here. The two men, Myrlyn H. Scott, coxswain, and Melvin P. Scott, AOM 2c, met on the former's ship when it was at Pearl Harbor.

Describing the meeting, Myrlyn wrote: "Here is a big surprise for you. It's something that happens once in a lifetime. I met my twin brother after being separated for two years. It was two years ago this month that we were separated. I guess it's 'one for the books.' Melvin came aboard my ship and everyone thought it was me. Boy, what a time we had. I was never so happy in all my life."

A letter received shortly before from the twin, Melvin, stated that he expected to return to the United States on leave in the near future. The coxswain was in Medford in the early spring after a tour of duty which took him into Mediterranean waters and to British Island ports. He was at San Diego for a time and at the time of writing was in the southwest Pacific.

Both young men attended Medford high school. Their parents now reside in Vancouver.

PEACHES AND TOMATOES READY ABOUT SEPT. 1ST

Harvesting of the main crop of peaches and commercial tomatoes will not get under way much before September 1, Assistant County Agent C. B. Cordy reported today.
