Bank to Aid Buying Surplus War Goods From Government
Eugene Thorndike, manager of the Medford Branch of the First National Bank of Portland, this week announced that a department has been organized in the First National Bank to disperse information regarding surplus war goods offered for sale by the federal government.

Those persons who may have a desire to buy a training plane or any other bit of surplus war property from the federal government can now get information on how to go about it from Mr. Thorndike. Mr. E. F. Slade, vice president of the First National Bank in Portland, will head the new department in the Portland head office of the bank and will clear requests from the bank's branches throughout the state. The department has been set up at the request of the surplus war properties administration.

Information will be available to tell how to acquire one of those puddle-jumping army jeeps, when and if they are placed on the market. Just now, however, they are not being sold, as the government needs them in winning the war, so would-be purchasers will have to wait.

Red stamps A8 through Z8 and A5 through D3 in ration book No. 4 valid indefinitely. Each stamp worth 10 points.
Processed Foods
Blue stamps A8 through Z8 and A5 through D3 in ration book No. 4 valid indefinitely. Each stamp worth 10 points.

Stamps No. 30, 31 and 32 in book No. 4 valid indefinitely (5 pounds each). Stamp No. 40 valid for 5 pounds home canning sugar to February 28, 1945. Stamp No. 33 valid on September 1 for five pounds.

SOGE TO PROVIDE VETERAN TRAINING

Southern Oregon College of Education, Ashland, Aug. 17 — Emmet F. McGraw of the Portland office of Vocational Division Veterans administration was here this week in the interest of setting on foot the program for education and training under Part VIII of veterans benefits as provided by congress. McGraw, representing Col. Paul I. Carter, manager Veterans Administration, stated that the Southern Oregon College of Education is one of the colleges approved by the Veterans Administration in Washington to give the training offered ex-service men by the Act of Congress.

The office of the Southern Oregon College of Education has been supplied with blanks to be filled by those applying for this training. These forms and all information may be had by writing or applying personally to the office. Ex-service men and women are eligible for the benefits.

While enrolled in and pursuing a course under this part, such person, upon application to the administrator, will be paid a subsistence allowance of \$50 per month, if without a dependent or dependents, or \$75 per month, if he has a dependent or dependents.
