BUTTERMILK AND SKIM MILK

A quart of buttermilk or a quart of skim milk has just one-half the nutritive value (measured in calories of energy) of a quart of fresh whole milk.

When milk (or cream) sours naturally it does so because the lactic acid bacilli naturally present in milk ferment the lactose (milk sugar) naturally present in milk, producing therefrom lactic acid.

Naturally sour milk is the same as buttermilk in that respect, except that most of the cream (butterfat) has been removed from the milk product known as buttermilk.

Skim milk is the milk product that remains after the cream has been removed. Skim milk is highly nutritious even though about half the calories in pure whole milk are in the cream, the butterfat. Skim milk, like buttermilk, is still a valuable source of protein and sugar, calcium, phosphorus, vitamin G (riboflavin). It is as sensible and sound to throw away refined white flour or white bread or feed it to the pigs as it is to throw away skim milk or feed it to the pigs.

The milk product left after the fat has been removed from the fresh milk by separator is practically the same as the milk product left after fresh milk has been allowed to stand until cream rises and the cream is skimmed off. But the so-called "buttermilk" which is manufactured by a process of working a few particles of some kind of fat or oil into skim milk or separator milk and perhaps doctoring it a bit with a culture of lactic acid bacilli to give it more or less the flavor of real buttermilk (from the churn) is not, in my opinion, a fair substitute for natural buttermilk.

Natural buttermilk is a wholesome, nutritious, healthful beverage for children and adults. It serves every purpose that acidophilus milk, or any other

kind of sour milk beverage can serve. Whether buttermilk or, if you like, whole sour milk, or acidophilus or Bulgarian milk is more efficacious in promoting a vigorous and healthful growth of lactic acid bacilli and in preventing putrefactive and disease-producing bacteria from multiplying in the intestine than fresh sweet milk is, I doubt. It must be remembered that fresh sweet milk always contains myriads of vigorous lactic acid bacilli.

As a source of calcium, phosphorus, vitamin B1 (thiamin) and vitamin B2 (G, riboflavin) skim milk, separator milk or natural buttermilk is equal to fresh whole milk—and it is well to remember that most Americans suffer from prolonged or lifelong deficiencies of these nutritional essentials.
