BIDDLE DEFIANCE OF SENATE IRKS

Washington, Aug. 25.—(U.P.)—The question of defiance of congress by the executive branch, raised a few months ago when a presidential aide, Jonathan Daniels, declined to appear before a senate committee, has again become a senate issue. This time the fire is directed at Attorney General Biddle. The attorney-general not only declined to submit the information sought by a senate committee, but blocked the war department from getting the same information, needed in a study of possible army disposition of the Breakers Hotel in West Palm Beach, according to charges made by Senator Ferguson (R., Mich.).

Train Wreck Due To High Speed on Curve
Washington, Aug. 25.—(U.P.)—Absence of adequate safeguards to prevent excessive speed on curves was assigned by the interstate commerce commission today as the cause of the derailment of an Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe passenger train near Maine, Arizona, last July 3, resulting in the death of four persons and the injury of 128.

TRAVEL PROBLEM WILL GET WORSE

Portland, Ore., Aug. 25.—(U.P.)—The next three months will see a national transportation situation more serious than at any time during the past three years, according to F. T. Westmeyer, Seattle, district manager for the Association of American Railroads.

Westmeyer spoke here at a meeting called to step up the car efficiency program. He called attention to the fact that freight loadings in July have already approximated the peak in October, 1943. The load is running 4 per cent ahead of a year ago, he said, and will increase into October which has always been the heaviest shipping month.
