London, Sunday, Aug. 27—(U.P.)—The Polish government here has approved a proposal calling for its virtual fusion with the Polish group in Moscow, taking a long stride toward solution of differences between the two factions, it was learned reliably today.

The government here is not giving up its claim to legality under the proposal put forward by its premier, Stanislaw Mikolajczyk, but is recognizing the need of an early solution to the dispute, informants said.

LIBERATORS HIT ENEMY BASES IN CENTRAL PACIFIC

Pacific Fleet Headquarters, Pearl Harbor, Aug. 26—(U.P.)—Big Marianas-based Seventh AAF Liberators plastered two Jima in the Volcano Islands for the second time in less than 24 hours Thursday, while other army and navy war planes pounded Yap, Nauru and other Japanese positions in the Carolines and the Marshalls, Adm. Chester W. Nimitz announced today.

A headquarters press release said B-24s dropped 47 tons of bombs on two Jima in a daylight attack Thursday, following a night attack announced yesterday. While the night raid was made without interception and against meager anti-aircraft fire, the daylight raid stirred up moderate to intense flak and approximately 10 interceptors. Three Japanese fighters were destroyed and one damaged.

Two of the Liberators were hit. The army and navy planes gave Nauru a good working over in their third and fourth attacks in three days. The press release said Ventura search planes in group one of fleet air wing two returned to the phosphate island for the second time Wednesday, while on Thursday Ventura and Seventh AAF Mitchells "again heavily bombed runways, gun positions and the town."

INSPECTION ENDED
Ensenada, Baja Cal., Aug. 26 (U.P.)—Gen Juan Felipe Rico, governor of the northern district of Baja California and commandant of Mexico's second military zone, has completed an inspection of U. S. army air-sea rescue service units of this area.

NEW STORM, MORE CHIEFS TO RETIRE IN WPB BLOW-UP

Washington, Aug. 26—(U.P.)—The volcanic eruption within the War Production Board, which already has blown off a chunk of the top crust, abated tonight but there were indications of another blow-up next week.

With Charles E. Wilson out in a huff as executive vice chairman of WPB and China-bound Donald M. Nelson seemingly being eased out of the production picture, 36-year-old Lt. Cmdr. J. A. Krug took over as "acting chairman" in an atmosphere thick with rumors of more resignations in the organization's high command.

Although a WPB spokesman said he did not know of any more resignations to come, friends of WPB Vice Chairman Sidney J. Weinberg, New York financier, expect him to quit next week. Weinberg, a partner in the Goldman-Sachs firm and a director in many other large business and industrial enterprises, has been in charge of procurement of executive personnel for Nelson. Long a friend of President Roosevelt, Weinberg had been reported striving to clear up differences between Nelson and Wilson.

Other unconfirmed rumors hinted that two other WPB vice chairmen were considering resigning—William Y. Elliott, in charge of the office of civilian requirements, and Arthur H.

Bunker, in charge of the production executive committee.

Los Angeles, Aug. 26—(U.P.)—It was quite confusing, but Paul A. Jenkins tonight announced the marriage of Paul W. Jenkins, president of the Jenkins Music Co., Kansas City Mo., was married in Pasadena Aug. 5 to Mrs. Evelyn Stoll, Pasadena socialite, it was announced by Paul A., week-ending in Los Angeles.

Paul W.'s sister is married to Paul A., who is publisher of the El Centro Post-Press and Brawley News in California. Paul W. was awarded a divorce July 31 in Kansas City from Mrs. Lucille McPherson Jenkins. Paul W. and his bride intend to return to Kansas City early next month.

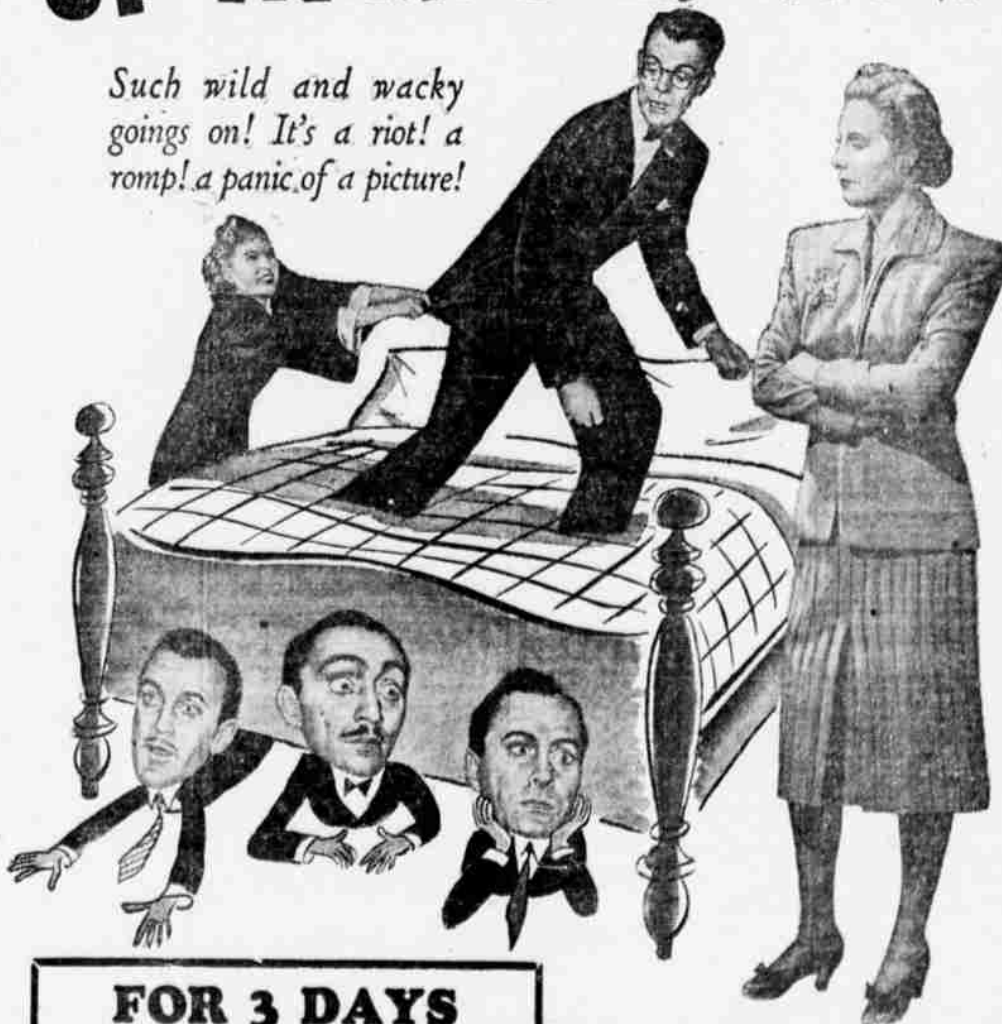
