

POSSIBILITY THAT 6 NIP ADMIRALS KILLED IN CRASH

Washington, Sept. 7.—(U.P.)—The possibility that a navy Liberator searchplane shot down an enemy transport carrying six Japanese admirals was the subject of speculation today on the basis of enemy broadcasts and a Pacific fleet announcement of air action.

The Axis broadcasts reported that a vice admiral and five rear admirals were killed by "enemy action" in the command area of the Yokosuka naval base which lies at the entrance to Tokyo harbor. This command area extends thousands of miles out to sea and is believed to encompass the Bonin and Volcano Islands.

The Pacific fleet announcement issued reported that a Liberator searchplane intercepted and shot down an enemy transport plane near Iwo Jima in the Volcanos on Monday. A medium bomber escorting the transport managed to escape, the announcement added.

The disclosures by the Japanese and the Pacific fleet headquarters came so close together as to arouse speculation that the enemy navy dignitaries were aboard the transport plane winged near Iwo Jima.

GARNETT DENIES GROUP POLITICAL

Washington, Sept. 7.—(U.P.)—Frank E. Garnett, Rochester, N. Y., newspaper publisher, told the house campaign expenditures committee today that the committee on constitutional government, of which he is trustee, is a non-political organization devoted to "promoting nationwide education on constitutional principles and free enterprise."

He branded as "entirely false" any charges that the committee is in politics and said it "does not in any way come within the scope of your congressional investigations."

Garnett formerly was chairman of the committee. The house group's attention to it was called by Sidney Hillman, chairman of the CIO political action committee, who said in recent testimony that any investigation of the PAC should be enlarged to take in the Garnett organization.

The Bolivian ministry of finance has set a maximum monthly quota of \$15,000 for the importation of motion-picture films and \$200 for importation of parts for motion-picture machinery.

ROBOMB ATTACKS ON LONDON OVER; LIGHTS ON SEPT. 17

London, Sept. 7.—(U.P.)—Duncan Sandys, chairman of the war cabinet committee on flying bomb counter-measures, announced today that "except possibly for a few last shots, the battle of London is over."

His declaration followed an announcement by the home security ministry that five years of blackouts would end Sept. 17, that fire watching would be all but abolished and that some guards would be placed on a part time, voluntary basis.

Sandys said Heinkel bombers carrying flying bombs pick-a-back, still would be able to operate on a small scale.

In the 80 days of the flying bomb campaign against London and southern England, more than 8,000 bombs were launched but 46 per cent were brought down by defenders, he disclosed. Twenty-nine per cent reached the London area and the other 25 per cent went astray.

The record defensive day was Aug. 28 when 101 robots approached the coast. Defenses knocked down 97 and only four reached London, he said.

Sandys revealed that some of the robots had been launched from Heinkel bombers which carried them over the North sea.

Fighter planes accounted for 1,900 flying bombs. Sandys formally thanked Americans for their aid in combatting the terror missiles.

WOMAN TESTIFIES HOW CROWD ACTED

Washington, Sept. 7.—(U.P.)—Mrs. Betty Lee McLaughlin of Los Angeles, today described for the mass sedition trial jury the post-Pearl Harbor meetings of the Friends of Progress at which the audience was told "Remember, the United States is not at war"—and urged to spread the slogan "bring the boys back home."

Describing a session on Feb. 28, 1942, she said that in response to the shout of "bring the boys back home," members of the audience changed in return: "Back from Ireland — back

from Iceland — back from England — back from the South Pacific."

WEST CAROLINES ISLAND BLASTED

Pacific Fleet Headquarters, Pearl Harbor, Sept. 7.—(U.P.)—Fighter planes from a carrier task group attacked in force against the Palau Islands in the western Carolines Tuesday, setting afire 17 small craft and inflicting heavy damage on enemy installations, it was announced today.

The raiders destroyed an ammunition or fuel dump and strafed warehouses and other in-

stallations during the assault against the Palau, which lie only 593 miles east of Davao in the Philippines, and 1200 miles west of Truk atoll.

The American pilots reported they encountered no enemy planes in the air over the targets.
