TROUT REGISTERS 24TH VICTORY AS TIGERS NIP TRIBE

Bengals Are Now Only One Game Behind Browns and Yanks—Cardinals Win.

New York, Sept. 8.—(U.P.)—It's safer to bank on two handy winners like Paul Trout and Hal Newhouse than to depend on tradition, but it was hard today to get beyond the fact that the Detroit Tigers have furnished the only three exceptions in 20 years to the American league's axiom that the team in first place on July 4 inevitably wins the pennant.

The Tigers, traditional strong finishers, have won only three pennants in those two decades, but each time they came from behind to take the lead after July 4. No other team in that time has been able to defy that unwritten rule.

Indians Blanked
The Tigers, who haven't reached first place yet this year, were only a game out today, behind the deadlocked St. Louis Browns and New York Yankees in the hectic race. Trout moved them closer yesterday with a three-hit, 3 to 0, shutout over the visiting Cleveland Indians. He took only 85 minutes to gain his 24th victory and sixth shutout while the Tigers went after Jim Bagby for 10 hits to win easily.

The Browns regained a tie for the lead in a story-book manner at Chicago last night, scoring three runs in the ninth to win 5 to 4.
In the National, Mel Ott got a three run homer, his 26th, and Ernie Lombardi hit a roundtripper with a man on base to stake Bill Voisell to his 19th victory: The Giants beating the Boston Braves at New York 9 to 3. Voisell yielded only three hits. The Cardinals scored two unearned runs with two out in the ninth at St. Louis to beat Chicago for the 14th straight time this year, 3 to 2.

Ed Heusser of the Reds shaded Fritz Ostermuller of Pittsburgh winning 2 to 1 in a duel at Cincinnati.
Relief Pitcher Anton Karl held the Brooklyn Dodgers to one hit for six innings to gain a 7 to 3 victory for the Phillies at Philadelphia.

Hurler Ad Liska of the Beavers edged out Steve (Smokestack) Legault of the Solons in a first game mound duel, in which each allowed seven hits and struck out five men. Johnny Gill doubled across the winning run in the fifth after Frank Shone had opened with a triple.

In the nightcap Portland clouted two solon hurlers for 21 hits, while Sacramento got 18 off three Beaver pitchers, including home runs by Lillo Marcucci in the first and Al McElreath in the third. Scores:
