

Your Health and Its Care

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WORK HARD AND LIVE LONG

Arteriosclerosis, hardening of the arteries, a gradual lessening of the resiliency or elasticity of the arteries, is an accompaniment of old age. Old age in some persons begins before forty, in others around fifty, in exceptional instances not until after sixty. It depends, as Dr. Brady saw it, on the quality or grade of material used for the tubing—that, he taught, explains why old age comes earlier in some families than in others.

What I don't know about heredity is simply astonishing—to people who don't think they know all about it. So don't take my ignorance seriously. It is my notion that it matters little or not at all how old your grandfather lived to be or whether he died of heart failure or from fracture dislocation of the upper cervical vertebrae complicated by a short fall. What really matters is the use or abuse to which you have subjected your arteries and the rest of your body.

Incidentally, old timer, if you were I you would worry more about the condition of your arteries than you do about the condition of your teeth, your hair, your eyesight or your ability to roll somersaults or to run upstairs two steps at a time or to spring a few blocks without getting fussed about it.

Having expressed his belief that inheritance is the chief cause of arteriosclerosis, Dr. Brady repeated or abated a lot or little to add that more commonly the degeneration (replacement of elastic or muscle cells with inelastic fibre) in the artery wall results from bad use of good vessels.

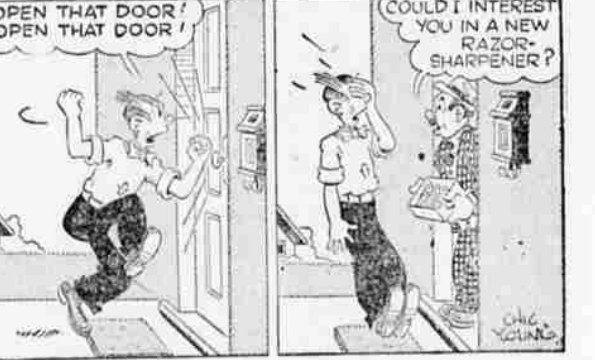
