

DISABLED VETS PICK MEMBER OF FIGHTING 96TH

Denver, Sept. 16.—(U.P.)—The 23rd national convention of Disabled American Veterans was concluded Friday with the election of Milton D. Cohn, Buffalo, N. Y., as national commander, succeeding James L. Monahan of St. Paul, Minn.

Cohn, a member of the "Fighting 96th" in the first World War, is in charge of the veterans division of the Erie County, New York, department of welfare.

Other national officers chosen at the closing session were the following vice commanders, in order: John E. Rainey, Pittsburgh, Pa.; Paul C. Corrigan, Albuquerque, N. M.; Eugene G. Soots, Pueblo, Colo.; W. F. Souder, Knoxville, Tenn.; Peter Griffin, St. Louis, Mo.; and the Rev. Manfred Bennett, Los Angeles, Calif., was chosen chaplain.
