

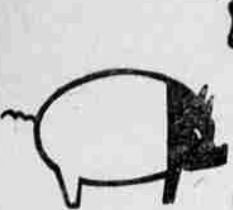
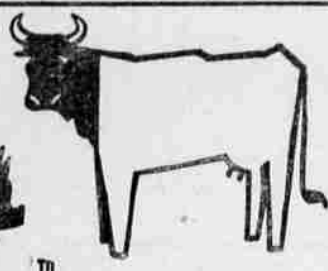
## Yanks Air Army Bound for Holland

**HAVE YOU A LITTLE BATTERY IN YOUR MOUTH?**

These are authorities to which I refer dentists or doctors who may suspect I dreamed this up when my pipe got too hot.

Some persons who have two dissimilar metals in fillings, bridges, crowns or other dentures suffer from persistent sores on tongue or inside of cheek, sores they may mistake for ordinary recurring canker sores.

Normal saliva is a fair electrolyte—it need not be particularly acid—and it may act on the dissimilar metals to set up a miniature galvanic battery in the mouth.

If you have more than your share of trouble with what you assume to be an obstinate or recurring canker sore, or maybe a smoker's patch (leucoplakia), and you know there are two dissimilar metals in your mouth, especially if the trouble is directly opposite or in the path between the two dissimilar metals, you may choose any of three courses:

1. Ignore it, grin and bear it.  
2. Have the dentist remove that last denture or filling and replace it with one made of the same metal as that in your old denture.  
3. Hang onto the last bridge—maybe it is made of gold—and have the dentist dig out the old amalgam fillings and doll your mouth up with gold exclusively.

Dentists commonly use various metals in dentures, from gold and silver to zinc and copper, stainless steel, chrome alloys etc.

According to the Jour. of the American Dental Association (June, 1933) "actual changes in electrical potential have been

observed in such patients by fine measurements"—that is, in the mouths of patients with such galvanic burns or sores.

**QUESTIONS & ANSWERS**  
Michéle's Medical Mystery  
Took son, 8, to doctor for check-up after recovery from measles. Doctor told me he had a murmur in the heart. Will you please explain to me what this means? Is there anything we can do to help this condition? (Mrs. T. F.)

Answer: A murmur is a soft blowing sound heard over heart blood vessel or lungs, sometimes heard over the fontanelle or soft spot on top of baby's head. A murmur may be heard in cases of anemia, until the blood regains normal strength. If your doctor fails to tell you what he thinks the murmur means he should be honest about it and either (1) ask for a consultation or (2) refer the boy to a diagnostician whose opinion carries weight.

**Fine Big Brother**  
I have a brother who is fifteen. He gets eczema every year. We have tried many things and even had him in hospital for a while. I know he suffers and I hope you can suggest some kind of cure for it. (Pvt. S. C.)

Answer: At least it can do your brother no harm to give the calcium and vitamin D treatment a try. Details in pamphlet on "Eczema"—for copy send a stamped envelope bearing your address.

**Old Skin and Pores**  
I have very old skin and enlarged pores, even after I out on my make-up. (Mrs. Mary)

Answer: Send stamped self-addressed envelope and ask for (send no stamp) pamphlet, "Acne (Blackheads and Pimples)." The skin has no pores if that means openings through which anything may be absorbed. What you call enlarged pores are the relaxed openings or mouths of the sweat ducts and sweat ducts. Use of creams and skin make-up is injurious to the complexion of a young woman. Such make-up should be left to the old women.

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RUML ADVOCATES  
TAX PLAN WHICH  
ENCOURAGES JOBS

Economist Points Out Program Should Not Be Solely For Government.

Many people assume that the only purpose which taxes serve is to raise money to pay the cost of government. Actually the kind of tax program we have can also affect such things as how much a dollar will buy (inflation or deflation), how people will spend their money, and most important, how many jobs there will be and whether wages will be higher or lower.

That was what Paul Hoffman, chairman of the committee for economic development, meant recently when he said, "too often in the past our tax programs have been framed in terms of what will lose the fewest votes. The vital question should be, 'what kind of tax program will lose the fewest jobs?' This is the vital question which the C.E.D.'s high employment tax plan seeks to answer. To my knowledge, this is the first attempt ever made to develop an overall federal tax system from the basic point of view of encouraging employment and increasing national income, as opposed merely to collect revenue from the income and jobs already existing. To me it is a highly realistic and practical approach.

**Matter of Sense**  
It is a matter of simple common sense that we will be better able to pay 16 to 18 billion dollars in postwar taxes out of a national income of, let us say, 140 billion dollars a year than out of the scant 100 billion dollars which was our "record" national income in 1940. A progressive tax policy thus becomes both a means and an end, and therefore a doubly important element in our present job of postwar planning.

A tax plan which encourages investment, greater production, higher wages, and more jobs will be a means of reaching a national income of \$140 billions annually. And only if we achieve such an end will we be able to carry our postwar tax load. Nor should sight be lost of the extra dividend paid by such a high level of productive employment in that it will cut down additional tax cuts which would be required for "pump priming" and the carrying of a large number of unemployed.

**Two Basic Guides**  
Also, the simple fact of a high tax and ample federal revenue does not necessarily mean a "healthy" economy. To devise a fair tax system that gives broad encouragement to expanded production and employment, we should then be guided by two basic tax considerations—taxes should be just high enough to balance the budget at some agreed level of high employment, and thereby protect the stability of our currency.

If we set our tax rates any higher we will reduce unnecessarily the money that private individuals have to spend and invest and will thus work against our attempts to reach a high level of employment and stay there.
