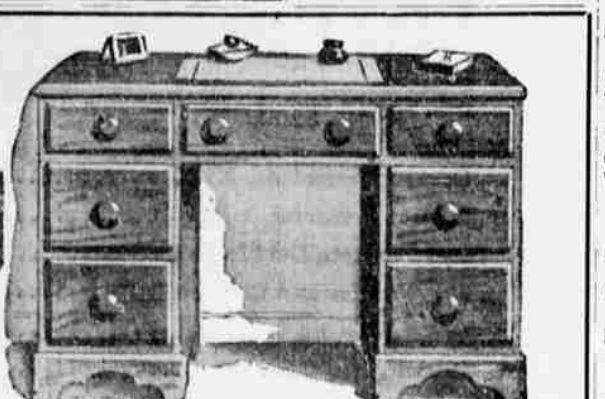

OVERSEAS GIFTS MUST BE MAILED BY OCTOBER 15th

BETTER BUY 'EM AND MAIL 'EM NOW!

OFFICIAL RULES

1. Packages to men and women overseas must be mailed between September 15 and October 15 and should be mailed as near October 1st as possible to insure delivery.

2. No package can be over 15 inches in length, or 34 inches in length and girth combined. No parcel can exceed 5 pounds in weight.

3. Every parcel should be labeled "Christmas Parcel" to insure delivery before Christmas.

4. Every package should be clearly addressed in ink on wrapping or cartons with name, rank, organization, A.P.O. address, and most important serial number.

5. Articles should be packed neatly in substantial boxes or containers, and should be wrapped with strong wrappings to withstand pressure of other mail, as well as long voyage.

6. All parcels must be prepaid. Prevalent rate is prepaid post rate from post-offices from which package is mailed in postoffice in care of which mail is addressed.
