

# IRISH BEAT PITT WITH EASE; NAVY AND DUKE UPSET

Indiana Defeats Michigan; Gophers and Indiana Gain Wins.

New York, Sept. 30.—(U.P.)—The "mighty" Irish of Notre Dame, described by their coach as the greenest football team ever to represent the school, proved today that he must have been talking about the color of their uniforms when they rolled to a typical 58 to 0 victory over Pittsburgh.

Taking up their inheritance as national champions of 1943, the highly geared football team toyed all day with a Pitt eleven that had shown to good advantage in winning its opener a week ago.

The Irish victory was only a measure less impressive than Army's 46 to 0 showing against North Carolina, but Navy, the third member of football's number one triumvirate, was the victim of a stunning 21 to 14 upset by North Carolina Pre-flight.

## Big Cat Forgot to Climb



When Government Hunter Kirby Tant's hounds took after the big cougar shown above, the animal elected to stay on the ground and fight it out rather than climb a tree as is the species' usual custom. Tant, who shot the eight-foot "cat" Sept. 23 in the vicinity of Round Top Mountain, is shown holding its tail while the body is supported by Pic. E. J. Crawford, a neighbor. Four of Tant's dogs were mauled before the hunter arrived on the scene and got in a fatal shot.

## FEDERAL HUNTER GETS COUGAR IN ROUND TOP AREA

Kirby Tant, government hunter, recently brought in his second cougar in three days which he shot in the area of Round Top Mountain. The animal measured well over 10 feet and managed to maul and scratch four of Tant's hounds in the fight.

The cougar did not climb a tree, as cougars usually do when beset by dogs, but struck at the hounds from a curved tree trunk. One of the hounds had a deep wound on the head, the flesh laid open to the skull and the other a deep gash to the bone on his leg. Two other dogs were less seriously injured.

A week ago Mr. Tant shot another cougar in the same vicinity measuring nearly eight feet, which had just killed a big four-point buck, and was gorged with fresh deer meat. The hounds treed the big "cat" and Tant shot it out of the tree.

Years ago the Tants had a young cub as a pet. He wore a collar and had the run of the place. However, as he grew up he developed a taste for chicken and eventually they were forced to dispose of him. Members of the Tant family all agree that cougar steaks are "fine eating," although they did not admit they had any intentions of so disposing in that fashion of the last cougar shot.

The government hunter stopped at Shady Cove school and showed the students the large cougar, which probably is the largest ever shot in this district. Many residents of Shady Cove have called at the Tant home to see the animal.

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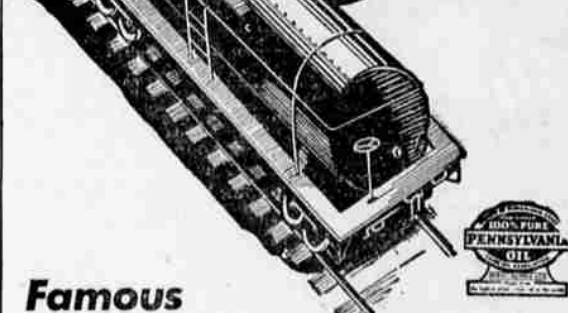
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
