2,200 PLANES IN ATTACK ON BERLIN

London, Oct. 6.—(UP)—The Americans sent more than 2,200 warplanes against Berlin and other targets in Germany today, and great, whirling air battles developed as the Luftwaffe rose to challenge one of the largest aerial armadas ever dispatched over the Reich for a single series of attacks.

Flying a 1,000-mile round trip 1,250 heavy bombers escorted by perhaps 1,000 fighters plastered four war plants in Berlin and seven other targets spread over a 200-mile long area. It was Berlin's 167 air attack of the war.
