Dr. Brougner Opens Baptist Campaign At Sunday Service

Dr. Russell More Brougner will conduct a "Spiritual Crusade" in the First Baptist church beginning Sunday and continuing through November 6.

Before entering evangelistic work, Dr. Brougner was for 10 years pastor of the Baptist Temple of Brooklyn, N. Y., where he had the largest regular Sunday night audience in Greater New York. His evening congregation averaged 1500 people each Sunday night.

Dr. Brougner served as an army chaplain with the 40th artillery during the first World war, and he has supplied many of the largest pulpits throughout the United States.

He comes from a noted preacher's family. His father, Dr. J. Whitcomb Brougner has held the pastorate of the largest Baptist church in America. His father and his brother are both in the ministry, at the present time in the First Baptist church of Glendale, Calif.

Dr. Brougner is in great demand as an evangelistic leader. He has here some years ago and has many friends who will welcome this opportunity to renew acquaintance and hear him speak.

Christian Pastor Giving Series of Morning Messages

Dev. Delbert W. Daniels, in a series of morning messages at First Christian church, Ninth and Oakdale, answers a call for the "dedication of self, life, possessions, service and purpose."

Members of Christian churches throughout the world have been called to a year of dedication by the leaders who are meeting in an international convention this week in Columbus, Ohio, with Dr. Clarence E. Lemmon of Columbia, Mo., presiding president.

The leaders declare, "As Christians we are deeply conscious that we have not arrested the forces that have brought the world to its present chaotic condition. We even admit that the same evils that torture the world are found in the life of the church. The church itself is in need of redemption. Yet we have faith that these forces so diametrically opposed to the will of God are doomed because they are opposed to His eternal purposes."

"To this faith we rededicate ourselves to the purpose of good will and the brotherhood of man, and to the causes and institutions of the church."
