## SHADY COVE MAN AWARDED HONORS FOR FINE RECORD

15th AAF in Italy—Technical Sgt. John H. Shull, 32, of (NSA) Shady Cove, Ore., crew chief, has been awarded the distinguished unit badge as a member of the 15th army air force Liberator bomber group which has been cited for "outstanding performance of duty in armed conflict with the enemy."

Sgt. Shull has also been awarded the good conduct medal, it was announced by the 15th army air force. In the words of the citation which accompanied this award, Sgt. Shull's work has "demonstrated fidelity through faithful and exact performance of duty, efficiency through capacity to produce desired results." It also mentioned that his "behavior has been such as to deserve emulation."

Commanded by Lt. Col. Joseph G. Russell of San Antonio, Tex., the group received the distinguished unit badge, the nation's highest organization award, for an attack on the aircraft factories at Wiener Neustadt, Austria, on May 10.

Sgt. Shull is a member of a veteran group which has completed over 100 missions against strategic targets in the network of German industrial, rail and oil centers throughout southern Europe and the Balkans. Serving as an airplane mechanic specialist, Sgt. Shull entered the service September 5, 1942. He attended the air force mechanic school at Keesler Field, Miss., and the B-24 factory school at Willow Run, Mich. He was formerly a shipyard construction worker prior to entering the service.
