But I tell you that's a lot of hooey—and it is ironical when we consider what goes on in most hospital delivery rooms.

Washington, Oct. 24—(U.P.)—The office of price administration today authorized increases of from 25 to 35 cents a barrel in the selling price of five varieties of rough rice at the producer level. The increase will apply to producers in all states except California, OPA said, with types of rice affected including Rexoro, Texas Patna, Nira, Fortuna, and Edith.
