When the error was discovered by the county clerk's office, between 1,000 and 1,200 ballots to soldiers had been mailed. County Clerk George R. Carter has an attorney general ruling that the mistake will not invalidate the ballot, inasmuch as there is no similarity between the names, Morse, and Smith his Democratic opponent.

Washington, Oct. 25.—(U.P.)—The Soviet Union and the United States are in sharp disagreement over armistice terms for Hungary, especially over the amount of reparations that former enemy should be forced to pay, it was learned today.
