# GENERAL CLAIMS JAPS DEFICIENT IN MALARIA WAR

Washington (U.P.)—Brig. Gen. R. W. Bliss, assistant surgeon general of the Army, has returned from a tour of South Pacific battlefronts with the conviction that there "is absolutely no comparison between Japanese medical equipment and ours."

The Japanese apparently have no malarial control and consequently incidents of malaria are "very high" in the Japanese army, Bliss said.

Bliss attributed much of this success to the effectiveness of DDT powder, which is sprayed over large areas of the islands by plane. He revealed that in a test a cage of flies and mosquitoes is left near the area being sprayed and that in an hour's time at least half of these are dead. All die less than 24 hours after the plane has passed.

Bliss also told the story of 143 British and Australian, all former prisoners of the Japanese, aboard a Japanese prison ship, part of a convoy out of Singapore, they were torpedoed, picked up by an American submarine and taken to Saipan.

Bliss met them when they arrived at the general hospital and quickly made apologies for the crude facilities. The men "expressed amazement at the speed with which they had been hospitalized and cared for by American doctors and nurses" and told Bliss that no apologies were needed.

"This is heaven," they said. While prisoners of the Japanese in Singapore, they said, they had "worked hard and been fed very little." All were suffering from tropical ulcers and exposure when they were picked up by the submarine.

# Tokyo Newspapers Make Most of Big "Naval Victory"

The Tokyo press made the most of big "news" Friday. Tokyo radio reported, saying that accounts of the U. S. "navy defeat" in the Philippines "all but filled the front pages."

"It was a red letter day for the papers as they had an opportunity to run deep cuts across three-fourths of the top of the page of the emperor and the paper who yesterday paid homage at Yasukuni shrine to the newly defied 20,197 fallen heroes," Tokyo said in a broadcast heard by United Press, San Francisco.

Mainichi said in an editorial that "the souls of the war dead must feel overwhelmed by the honor accorded them and must be overjoyed at the receipt of the glorious war results from the southern theater of the war."
