FAMOUS EXPLORER HELD FOR FRAUD

Huntington Park, Calif., Oct. 28—(U.P.)—Dr. Arthur F. Torrance, 57, explorer and authority on tropical diseases whose wealthy bride died of a mysterious skull fracture three years ago on their honeymoon in Monterey, Mexico, tonight faced federal mail fraud charges but said he was sure he could "explain everything."

Dr. Torrance was arrested just before his scheduled departure from Los Angeles harbor as ship's steward on a merchant marine vessel after a secret

grand jury indictment accused him of forging his wife's name to a draft for \$800 in October, 1941, a month before she died, and mailing it to a Kalamazoo, Mich., bank for deposit.

PFC. HENSELMAN COMPLETES BIG MURAL FOR ARMY

Camp Ellis, Ill.—Pfc. Phillip Henselman, Medford, Ore., has just completed another of his many army murals—this time for Camp Ellis, an army service forces training center in western Illinois. His current work, a huge panel 60 feet wide and 18 feet deep depicting a tropical floral scene, is now a center of attraction at the main service club.

The 23-year-old artist has been wielding the brush for some time. His first mural was "Scheherzade" for the music room of the Medford high school, and the second was an "Escapism" piece for the canteen plus a light western mural at the USO.

Henselman entered the army more than two years ago and while stationed at Fitzsimmons General Hospital, Denver, he completed the largest mural in his experience. It involved a series of eight panels with a combined area of 1600 square feet, depicting scenes from early Colorado history, plus an 800-foot curtain.

Murals comprise only a part of Henselman's work. He has exhibited paintings at Los Angeles and other art centers and has sold a few pieces to private collectors.
