Dewey Gaining Slightly in Close Race

Dewey Gaining Slightly in Close Race

Late October samples of voter preference show no change in several states and small gains for Dewey in several others. These gains cannot be considered conclusive. They are significant principally because they indicate that Dewey seems to have prevented his opponent from increasing his early lead to a position of clear-cut advantage. The margin shown for Roosevelt at the start of this series of articles would not permit much defection without the possibility of losing the election. That margin has not been widened, and the results in the remaining states to be reported on may show it to have narrowed slightly.

In the preceding article, no change was shown in the states of Maine, New Hampshire, Connecticut and Wyoming. A gain for Roosevelt was indicated in Michigan. Single-point gains were shown in West Virginia and Oregon. Nevada fluctuated one point toward Dewey and Idaho two points toward Roosevelt. Of the states reported today, Delaware, Maryland, Illinois and Missouri show single-point or two-point gains for Dewey. New Jersey, Oklahoma, Kentucky and Minnesota show no change. In Colorado, more intensive sampling since September now establishes a definite lead for Dewey, taking the state out of the pivotal group.

Fluctuations of one or two points in a sampling operation are to be expected purely from the laws of chance. While this election may be decided—as was the state of Michigan in 1940—by fractions of a percentage

point in one or more states of high electoral value, it is not at all likely that poll measurements can be that fine in making predictions. Therefore, results—though computed in decimals—are interpreted in terms of the nearest full percentage point (e.g., anything between 50.8 and 51.5 is reported as 51. For metric exactness, not only the mathematical limitations of sampling would be involved but—far more important—the question of what types of people will turn out on election day in what numbers. If, for example, the ratio of turnout should be higher in cities, or in the country, than anticipated—or higher for any other group—the results would vary from preferences as expressed to the pollsters. Data on preferences are always presented only as an interpretation of the samples taken, and subject to deviation of three percentage points.

In 1940 this poll indicated that Roosevelt's late campaigning prevented Willie from crossing the 50% line in important states. During these last days before this election Roosevelt again is making personal appearances and campaigning with full force. He appears still to hold a narrow advantage. In the fixed states he holds 176 electoral votes out of the 268 he needs, while Dewey holds only 60. In the 18 pivotal states so far reported he is showing no appreciable gain since September. Preliminary returns indicate the same will hold true for the five pivotal states still to be reported, with a slight loss possible.

PRICES ADJUSTED ON PENS, PENCILS

Portland.—Good news for pen-pushers is contained in an OPA announcement that steps have been taken to hold the line on prices of fountain pens and mechanical pencils and that dollar-and-cent prices will be set on these items at both retail and wholesale starting November 1.

Two years' limitation on production and the great consumer demand have combined to make prices out of line on these articles, Hosea Evans, district OPA price executive, explained, so the new regulation was drawn up after consultation with the industry in order to maintain fair prices at all levels.

The new regulation applies to all fountain pens and mechanical pencils shipped by manufacturers on and after November 1, the effective date of the new regulations Evans said.
