REV. BROCKHAUS WILL BE PASTOR AT GRAND FORKS

At a meeting of the congregation of Zion Lutheran church held following the worship services last Sunday, the resignation of the pastor, the Rev. Karl W. Brockhaus, who has been called to St. Mark's Lutheran church, Grand Forks, N. Dak., was formally accepted with reluctance by the congregation.

Pastor Brockhaus by his resignation closes a three year ministry in the city. Prior to coming to Medford he served as assistant to the pastor of St. John's Lutheran church, Beaver Dam, Wis.

Both Pastor and Mrs. Brockhaus have been active in community affairs as well as in leadership of their own church activities. The latter has been serving as board member of the newly formed Y.M.C.A. and is president of the Medford Council of Church Women. She also holds office as vice-president of the Women's Missionary society of the Pacific Synod of the United Lutheran Church in America. Rev. Brockhaus in the past has served as secretary of the Medford Ministerial association and at the present time is vice-president of that organization.

Pastor and Mrs. Brockhaus will leave Medford the latter part of this month or early in December, depending on when arrangements can be made for a new minister here. The pastor stated that they will leave their numerous friends both in the congregation and the city at large with many regrets.
