

IDAHO COWBOY WINS ELECTION

BOISE, Idaho, Nov. 10—(U.P.) The man who rode into Idaho politics on a horse, and bearing all the impedimenta of a cowboy-actor, achieved an ambition of long standing today and will serve in the United States sen-

ate for the next six years in the seat now occupied by Sen. D. Worth Clark.
Glen H. Taylor defeated Clark by the slim margin of 202 votes in the Idaho primary, but he built up nearly 4,000-vote lead at the general election to defeat Gov. C. A. Bottolfsen, the Republican candidate.
The one-time minstrel, who in his earlier years entertained thousands of persons in his own tent theater shows that played at cross roads throughout most of the west, reached the acme

DOUGLAS, LUCE BATTLE LOOMS

HOLLYWOOD, Nov. 9—(U.P.) Helen Gahagan Douglas, brown-haired beauty of the Democratic party who carried southern California politics from smoky back rooms to the plush-lined drawing rooms of Hollywood today became the second glamor girl in congress and said she was prepared to battle it out with Clare Boothe Luce, fiery Republican charmer.

Mrs. Douglas won her post in Washington after a neck-and-neck race with Attorney William Campbell, Republican candidate for the 14th district post.

Wife of Actor Melvyn Douglas, now in India as a major with the U. S. arm, the shapely stage and screen musical star carried on her campaign by making more than 300 political speeches—none of which were for herself.
Instead, she stumped all over the country urging Americans to vote for a fourth term for President Roosevelt.
