## RECRUITS SOUGHT AS OPERATORS BY AIRWAYS STATION

Authority has been received by the civil airways aeronautical airway communication station here to recruit a class of 35 communicator trainees, grade CAF-4, for assignment to 7th region stations, which comprises Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Montana. Salary will start at \$1,800 per year. This class will be trained at Seattle center convening November 20 or within a week thereafter.

In order to qualify, an applicant must be able to type 30 words per minute, be between 18 and 39 years of age, have two years' college education or aeronautical or communications experience. Either sex will be accepted, but not husband and wife teams.

Trainees will receive six weeks' training at the center, then will be assigned to field stations for on-the-job training at CAF-5, \$2,000 per year. Later re-assignment to a training center for additional training will be made if required. War veterans will be given preference.

## JUVENILES HELD IN COUNTY JAIL FOR BURGLARIES

Three Medford juveniles, aged 15 and 16, are held in custody at the county jail after having signed a statement confessing burglary of Humphrey Motor Co., 33 South Riverside, Tuesday night. Names have not been divulged by the sheriff's office, pending the youths' arraignment before the county court.

A cash register containing \$8 was taken from the office of the company and was later recovered in the Hill orchard on Stewart avenue. About \$4 of the money also was recovered.

The case was investigated by Dick Baize of Medford city police and Verne Smith of the sheriff's office and arrest of the boys was the result.

The sheriff's office said the boys signed a statement admitting theft of 20 bicycles of which four complete ones and numerous parts of others were found cached beneath a county bridge and at the home of one of the boys. A truck was used to haul the loot to the courthouse.

Deputy sheriffs today recovered a complete bicycle and numerous parts of others cached away in the Dark Hollow district. Worth \$700 and \$800 worth of tools, guns, auto accessories and other loot has been recovered, the sheriff stated.

Smith said parties who have missed miscellaneous articles may call at the sheriff's office and recover their stolen property by identification.
