KWEILIN ATTACK IS STEPPED UP BY JAP FORCES

Bitter Fighting For Main Fortifications of Former Site of American Air Base

Chungking, Nov. 10—(U.P.)—Japanese troops are attacking Kweilin with "increased vigor" and are engaged in bitter fighting with Chinese garrison troops in the main fortifications of the city, a Chinese army spokesman said today.

(There was no information from Chungking supporting a Japanese claim that Kweilin and Liuchow, once the sites of U. S. air bases 90 miles apart in Kwangsi province, had been "completely captured." Indeed, the Japanese themselves issued confused reports. After announcing capture of both cities, Tokyo radio, heard by United Press, San Francisco, said merely that Kweilin had been "encircled" and that 50,000 Chinese troops were trapped within the city.)

The spokesman said the Japanese were approaching Liuchow along a half-dozen routes and had advanced to a point approximately 15 miles from the city.

At Kweilin, the spokesman said, enemy troops have crossed the Kwei river outside the east gate of the city and are "in bitter engagement with our main fortifications."

(The Kwei river flows at the very edge of the city.)

(A Domei news dispatch, recorded by FCC, said the Japanese captured Kweilin, capital of Kwangsi province, at noon Friday (Tokyo time) and claimed the Chinese 31st army had surrendered.)

(Tokyo, quoting a dispatch from the "Kweilin front," said later that the fate of 50,000 Chinese troops in Kweilin "has now been sealed by the complete encirclement" of the city. "Not a single retreating enemy is permitted to pass through the Japanese cordon around Kweilin.")

A 14th AAF communique reported bad weather made operations impossible in the Kweilin area, but that Maj. Gen. Claire Chennault's P-40s penetrated the overcast to strafe Poaching airfield, west of Hengyang, Wednesday.

A Chinese communique yesterday charged the Japanese used poison gas in an attempt to break down Chinese defenses in Kweilin.
