New York, Nov. 13 (UP)—Stocks lost fractions to more than a point today in what has come to be regarded as customary Monday selling.

A factor in the decline, however, was said to be the recommendation of a leading business service that holdings be disposed of at this time in order to pocket profits.

The service said caution still should be exercised in view of the uncertainty as to extent of the war in Europe and the "serious doubts" that taxes, pricing policies and other regulations are to be revised in such a manner to permit satisfactory profits during reconversion.
