YEAR'S GROWING SEASON LONGEST ON RECORD HERE

This year's growing season, the number of days between the last killing frost in spring and the first killing frost in fall, was the longest ever recorded here, according to the United States Weather Bureau. The interim between frosts this year was 203 days, the next longest previous record being 202 days in 1940. The date of the last killing frost in the spring of 1944 was April 25, the date of the first killing frost this fall was yesterday, November 14.

Shortest growing season ever recorded here was 119 days in 1917. Then the last killing frost was June 12th; the first killing frost, October 17.

The average length of growing seasons is 166 days. The average date of the latest killing frost in the spring is May 2, and the average date of the earliest killing frost in the fall is October 16.

BAILEY INDICTED BY GRAND JURY

The grand jury, after a recess of three weeks, resumed its work of investigating eight or nine criminal cases this morning. A number of cases were deferred from the opening session to enable assembling of new evidence and further investigations before closing the cases, one way or the other.

At the opening session, Fred A. Bailey, San Quentin prison camp escapee, was indicted for first degree murder. Bailey was charged with inflicting head wounds during a robbery attempt last September 3, that proved fatal to Ira Clyde Carman. Bailey, held in the county jail, is scheduled to go on trial November 23. He is represented by Attorney Rawles Moore named by the court.
