## FLIER RETURNS FOLLOWING 104 TRIPS IN C-B-1

A 10th Air Force Base in India—C.B.—With more than 1000 combat hours to his credit in the China-Burma-India theater, including 104 trips over the famed "hump," Capt. Gordon J. Andrews, 22, of Sacramento, Cal., is heading back to the United States for a well earned leave. Andrews' combat achievements stand as records for fliers in this area. During his first month in India he crossed the "hump" 25 times. That was in February, 1943. In the first 15 days of the next month he flew the treacherous route 26 times—including 11 round trips.

Recalling the days when a large number of his squadron were lost flying supply missions, Andrews said, "We would sneak out at dawn and dusk in weather that nobody but a damn fool could fly in. Those were volunteer missions. The patrols were moving toward the Japanese lines and it was our job to supply them by air.

Those were the days," the tall young veteran recalled. "I remember one day, I took off and coaxed the ship over the hump toward China. I circled and circled, trying to find a hole in the weather. Just as I was about to set down, I received a radio message from my base telling me to return.

"When I returned and landed I asked why it had been sent. They told me—the weather was reported bad up there—too bad to land. That was a most enlightening bit of information."

Andrews, who came overseas as a staff sergeant, joined the army in 1940. He is returning a captain, wearing a Distinguished Flying Cross with four clusters, the air medal with four clusters and the presidential citation given to the second troop carrier squadron.

**VOROSHILOV OUT OF RED COUNCIL**

Moscow, Nov. 22—(U.P.)—Marshal Klementy E. Voroshilov, chairman of the Soviet defense council and one of Russia's foremost military figures, has been "relieved of his duties" on the council, it was revealed today.

News of the marshal's removal from office was disclosed in an official announcement published in the Soviet press this morning.

Voroshilov is a member of the Red army general staff and accompanied Premier Marshal Josef Stalin to Tehran for the "big three" meeting with Prime Minister Winston Churchill and President Roosevelt.
