

DINING CAR HELP HELD FOR FRAUD; HINT LABOR PLOT

Los Angeles, Nov. 25.—(U.S.)—Indictment and arrest of 135 stewards and waiters for manipulating \$200,000 worth of dining car checks on the Union Pacific "Challenger" tonight brought a charge that the railroad was using the indictments as an attempt to break a waiters' union.

The government accused 23 white stewards and 112 Negro waiters on the Omaha-Los Angeles Challenger of serving meals to guests and pocketing the money instead of turning it over to the railroad. This, said the indictment, cost the Union Pacific \$200,000 a year.

Guests paying the pocketed checks didn't lose money, but didn't get all they paid for, federal attorneys said, because conspiring chefs made food meant for 400 stretch to serve 700.

The stewards and waiters were arrested on trains or at their homes in Los Angeles, Las Vegas, Salt Lake City, Cheyenne and Omaha—the division points where the Challenger stops on its speedy run. They had been indicted secretly yesterday. Most of them were promptly bailed out on \$1000 each by their unions.

The FBI said the arrests came after three months' investigation by their men and railroad special agents, many of whom disguised themselves as stewards to see how the asserted fraud worked.

But District Secretary Flend Cunningham of the A. F. L. dining car waiters' union said that the indictments were "ridiculous" and "an attempt of the Union Pacific company to break up the union."

The chefs who stretched the food were mentioned as conspirators—but were not indicted. The \$18,000 a month the government said was netted in the fraud was divided between the waiters and stewards, with the chefs getting a small cut.

ARMORED ALLIED PATROLS BATTER HUNS AT FAENZA

Rome, Nov. 25.—(U.S.)—Advanced armored patrols of the British 8th army, smashing northward against "very fierce" German resistance, have reached the eastern outskirts of Faenza, vital road and communications hub on the Rimini-Bologna highway. Allied headquarters announced today.

Breaking the lone weathered stalemate, British troops burst out of their Cosina river bridgeheads to the south and raced three and one-half miles in the face of fiercely resisting Nazis, who flung all available tank and infantry forces to support the panzer grenadiers. The Allied advance carried to the village of Borogo D'Urbecco, adjoining Faenza on its eastern outskirts. Three hundred German prisoners of the 26th panzer division were taken in the fighting.

Polish troops, on the British left flank, in a continuation of their limited advance, occupied two important hills commanding the ground south of the Marzeno river. Monte Chissuolo, six miles south of Faenza, and Monte Castellaccio, eight miles south southeast, were taken.

The American 5th army front south of Bologna generally was quiet.
