## HOLT RESIGNS AS JACKSON COUNTY WELFARE DOCTOR

Resignation of Dr. William W. P. Holt as county physician was announced following the last meeting of the Jackson county public welfare commission. Dr. Holt has served in the office for the past eight years.

Commission members announce that patients are being cared for by a panel arrangement of four doctors supplied by the Jackson County Medical society.

Reports submitted at the meeting were to the effect that 831 old-age assistance cases were handled during the month of October, expenditures being \$27,346. This is but slightly more than September when old-age assistance totaled \$27,024. General assistance, for 204 cases totaled \$7,775 as compared to \$6,432 for September for 164 cases.

Twenty-five children were maintained in foster homes at a cost of \$579, the report shows, while last month 19 children were kept in foster homes at a total cost of \$469. Aid to dependent children totaled \$4,624 for 158 children as compared to \$4,329 for 159 children for September. Nine cases of assistance to the blind totaled \$422 for October as compared to \$438 for ten cases for the previous month.

## TURKEY GROWERS TO START KILLING

Killing and shipping of Christmas turkeys in Jackson and Josephine counties, for both army and civilian use, will start next week, a representative of Swift and Company reports. Fattening of the fowls, delayed both by a late hatch and poor growing conditions, has been underway for a couple of weeks. Ceiling prices are being paid for both civilian and army use turkeys.

It is estimated that approximately 25,000 valley birds were sold for the Thanksgiving trade, leaving between 70,000 and 75,000 in the two counties for the Yule and post-Yule trade. The turkey production was estimated at the start of the season at 100,000 birds.

## Customs Men Seize Smuggled Cigarettes

San Diego, Cal., Dec. 1.—(U.P.)—United States customs officers have seized 1,000 packs of American cigarettes during the first three weeks of this month from persons attempting to smuggle them from Mexico, customs officials reported today.

Investigators said cigarette smuggling has increased several hundred per cent since the U.S. shortage with some persons attempting to bring back as many as 30 cartons. (Regulations permit a tourist to bring back three sealed packs and one opened pack. Prices in Tijuana, Mex., now run between 12 cents and 20 cents for "standard brands.")
