POST-WAR AUTOS TO MAKE USE OF NEW MATERIALS

Detroit—(U.P.)—Wide use of war-developed materials and improvements ready when war broke out are predicted by D. R. Bathrick, general sales manager for General Motors corporation, Pontiac motor division, when the industry starts making automobiles again.

One postwar improvement will be use of indium, now used by aircraft manufacturers on engine bearings to prevent corrosion, Bathrick said.

Indium to Be Used
 "The use of indium for bearings was patented by Clarence F. Smart, Pontiac motor metallurgist, before the war. Before Smart's discovery, indium was used in the jewelry and dental trades to prevent tarnish."

"Plastics have been developed both before and during the war," Bathrick said. "New plastics likely to be offered after the war may find a place in automobile construction, but not in bodies. Chief uses at the moment appear to be in ornamentation, steering wheels and fittings."

Synthetic rubber, he said, has been found to be equal or superior to natural rubber for many purposes except tires, and is expected to be used widely for grommets, bumpers, battery cases, seals, bellows, gaskets and shims.

"Use of phosphorescent paint for instrument panels also interests our engineers. This is a development used widely in aircraft industry to avoid glare and eyestrain."

Production techniques developed or made common through war work also will have wide application, Bathrick said, including high-frequency induction heating for heat treating, electronic controls for welding and heat treating and centrifugal precision casting of steel for small parts which require high strength or heat treatment.

SAVE YOUR TEETH

Man who says he is past 85 writes:

I attended a lecture delivered by you in Lincoln, Nebraska, some years ago, and ever since that night have been a follower of yours... breathing and the iodine ration have done wonders for me... my circulation has been improved to such an extent that I am no longer bothered with cold clammy hands and feet... (Signed—D. D.)

Memorandum: We must be sure to include belly breathing and the iodine ration (my spelling Iodin Ration) in the booklet in preparation on "The Forgotten People."

After that lecture, believe it or not, I received an official communication from the Nebraska State Dental Society or Association (I forget the actual name), anyway some organization of dentists, expressing approval of my teachings about care of the teeth, oral hygiene, dentistry, etc.

I hasten to explain, however, that it was some time after that, as nearly as I can recollect, that I tossed toothbrushes and dentifrices out of the window, so far as preservation of the teeth is concerned, and probably few dentists in Nebraska have approved of anything I have said or taught about the teeth or their care since then. I mean officially or publicly.

Recently I revised the No. 1 Little Lesson in Ways of Health—SAVE YOUR TEETH—it is No. 1 because I believe saving the teeth is the most important rule of personal health. I carefully deleted from the new edition (1) the trade name I tried to get the dentists to adopt for their office signs, professional cards, stationery, etc., and (2) mention of the peg tooth (that was a grievous error on my part

and I have published my acknowledgment of the error several times). I have introduced into the new edition a chapter on Immediate Dentures, which, I suppose, will not please practitioners of the nineteenth century school, but on the other hand it should help to promote wider recognition of this modern technique by people whose business, professional or social engagements would be too greatly hampered by the necessity of going toothless for weeks or months.

The new edition of SAVE YOUR TEETH is available to any reader who asks for it (clipping is not a request), incloses twenty-five cents and stamped envelope bearing his address.

So far only a few hundred dentists have asked for it.
