

GERMAN INTRIGUE SHOWN IN MASTER RACE DRAMA HERE

Craterian Shows Dramatic
Expose — "Youth Runs
Wild" Heads Rialto Show

The dramatic "inside" story of Germany's secret bid for dominance in a third World War is engrossingly told in "The Master Race," opening today at the Craterian.

Woven around the theme that the nazis have merely been figureheads for the real leaders of Germany — the fanatics who evolved the "master race" theory which has motivated both world wars—and that these same leaders are even now preparing to try again in another 20 years to conquer the world, the picture presents a vivid glimpse of their operations.

The central character is a Col. Von Beck, one of the Junker old guard who firmly believes in Germany's destiny, even as the German armies are collapsing. On the eve of surrender he disguises himself as a Belgian patriot and goes to the little village of Kolar in Belgium where, as the allied forces march in, he pretends to be anxious to help in the task of reconstruction.

Instead, he stirs up unrest among the villagers and sets them against the American and British troops. With many of his fellow-fanatics doing the same thing in other occupied areas, Von Beck hopes the ultimate result will be to arouse such dissension between the allies and the peoples of these areas as to make it easy for Germany to launch another war at some opportune time in the future.

How the ambitious scheme works out in Von Beck's case provides the thrills in this drama.

**JAP FLIERS LOSE
HEADS, SAYS AGE**

New York, Dec. 9—(U.P.)—Cmdr. David McCampbell, 34, ranking naval ace of the south Pacific with 34 Japanese planes, said today he had great respect for the Japanese flier, but—"he is taught to play follow the leader and when he loses his leader, he loses his head."

McCampbell, who has had three planes shot up, but has never been wounded described one instance in the battle of the Philippines on Oct. 24 when he and his wingman, Lt. Roy Rushing of McGhee, Ark., took on 40 Japanese fighters, who, when they lost the bomber group they were escorting, went into a Lufberry circle, each guarding the other one's tail, because "they didn't know what else to do."

When they pulled out of the circle McCampbell and Rushing picked off a total of 15.
