Our druggist says he cannot make up the formula you give on p. 30 of the booklet "So You Have Indigestion?" because the amount of lactated pepsin is not indicated. He says it calls for 3 oz. of the salts and 1 oz. of glycerin but it does not specify how much pepsin. (T. O. B.)

It is as plain as the nose on a lady's face—a saturated solution of magnesium sulfate (Epsom salts) in elixir of lactated pepsin with glycerin, mixed in the proportion of three fluidounces of the solution with one fluidounce of glycerin.

ten cents and stamped pre-addressed envelope). But I contend any druggist who can take his mind off the general merchandise for 15 seconds should be able to find the answer to the puzzle as it stands.

I wish people who try to get the formula and find glycerin not available would try out the substitution suggested—simply a saturated solution of Epsom salts in four fluidounces of elixir of lactated pepsin (which contains some glycerin anyway) just as the booklet directs for the formula as there given, and report their experience, for the benefit of other sufferers from chronic cholecystitis (gall-bladder trouble).

I simply dare not take chances on what might happen to more detailed instructions for the use of this medicine if I were to offer them here. Editorial plastic surgery used to send me right up in the air, but with the extreme shortage of print paper it became chronic and so I quit reading my own stuff.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS
Six Operations
Please send your pamphlet on hernia. I have been operated six times for hernia, but it always recurs in a few months.

Answer—As a matter of fact, although one would hardly suspect it, listening to the surgeons sounding off when they are trying to sell the patient an operation, recurrence of hernia occurs in at least one out of every four cases, sometime after the operation. Anyone with hernia should remember this when deciding whether to have the ambulant (injection) treatment or the radical operation. Hernia is just as likely to recur after ambulant treatment as after the radical operation, but if it does, at least you haven't risked your life to have a try at it and you haven't lost a month's wages while confined to hospital.

Will the corn cure you recommend help bunions? (C. W. W.)

Answer—No. The so-called "corn cure"—solution of thirty grains of salicylic acid in one-half ounce of flexible collodion—may be painted on corn, wart or callus once a day for a week or more, to soften the corn or wart or callus and enable you to wipe it away. It cures nothing. The corn or callus will return if the friction or pressure causing it is not removed. It is a diabolical great toe joint, with an inflamed bursa pad over it. Nothing short of surgery can cure bunions.

CHINESE OFFENSE HURLS JAPS BACK 65 MI. IN 5 DAYS

Chungking, Dec. 9—(U.P.)—Well-trained and equipped Chinese reinforcements commanded by Gen. Tang En-Po, continuing an offensive which has pushed the Japanese back 65 miles in five days, have recaptured the Lilingkwan mountain pass on the Kweichow-Kwangsi border, 110 miles southwest of Kweichow, a Chinese high command communique announced today.

The communique also reported the recapture of Shanshan, railway town 30 miles south of Tushan, the recapture of which was announced yesterday, indicating that the Japanese who had threatened to engulf the whole of southwest China, would soon be driven completely from Kweichow province. Only remnant Japanese forces now remain in the areas southeast and southwest of Tushan.

Newly appointed Minister of War Gen. Chen Cheng confidently announced that "the critical period in the present Kweichow campaign is over" and that the immediate threat to Kweichow had been smashed.

Washington, Dec. 9—(U.P.)—Chairman J. A. Krug of the War Production Board said today that yarn is being set aside for the production of 13,000,000 additional infants' and children's knit underwear and sleeping garments.

A complete list of members was submitted for approval to allied authorities who requested 12 hours to study appointments to the various posts, it was said.

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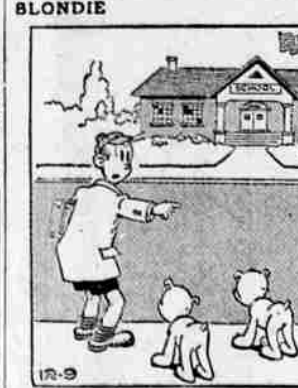
