DOCTORS REPORT PENICILLIN CURE FOR GONORRHEA

Chicago, Dec. 14—(UP)—Successful treatment of gonorrhoea with a single injection of penicillin X, a new variety of the drug, was reported today by a group of four Washington, D. C., physicians writing in the Journal of the American Medical Association.
The four doctors, Henry Welch, Lawrence E. Putnam, William Randall and Robert P. Herwick, reported that 64 patients out of 68, or 94 per cent treated, were cured with a single intramuscular injection of 25,000 units of the drug. The patients treated included 35 men and 33 women, the report said.
"Although the number of cases reported here is small," the doctors said, "it further work substantiates the fact that a large proportion of cases of gonorrhoea can be cured with a single intramuscular injection of penicillin X, the public health control of this disease, which has been materially affected by the use of commercial penicillin, will be further facilitated."
