That, said the court, was trading on the toes of non-Celtic Leland Holzer, who sells automobiles under the legally-approved title of "The Spilling Irishman."

"Happy" McDonald once worked for "Smiling" Holzer and sold so many cars he went into business for himself as "The Happy Irishman." Holzer claimed this was a trespass on his good name.

A third car dealer, presently trading as "The Laughing Irishman" wasn't commenting.

Arrangements for Finn-Russian War Debt Worked Out

 The arrangements by which

Finland will pay Russia \$300,000,000 worth of goods as indemnity for war damages under terms of the Russian-Finnish armistice agreement have been worked out fully, the Moscow radio said today in a broadcast reported by the FCC.

The deliveries, to be made between September 19, 1944, and September 19, 1950, will consist of various machinery and sea and river-going craft valued at \$175,000,000 and timber, paper, cellulose and paper products valued at \$125,000,000, the broadcast said.
