DUAL CITIZENSHIP OF JAPS RANKLES HOOD RIVER POST

Hood River, Ore., Dec. 21.—(U.P.)—The Hood River post of the American Legion expunged the names of 16 Japanese-Americans from the post war honor roll "Because we have every good reason to believe that they are citizens of Japan while claiming citizenship in this country," post officials explained today.

After a meeting last night in which the tumultuous issue was discussed, the post issued a statement denying that economic interests were involved in the action. The statement pointed out that not all Japanese names were removed from the roster and said that the post "would be proud to replace the names of those Japanese on our honor roll now serving in the armies of the United States when and if they or a relative will make an authenticated written statement that they have renounced their Japanese citizenship."

The post further questioned the wisdom of permitting Japanese to return to the Pacific coast at this time and demanded to know why the governors of the three Pacific coast states were not consulted in the move to return them. The statement declared that west coast citizens should refrain from violence and pointed to the post's pledge to uphold law and order.
