SILVER BILL SIGNED

Washington, Dec. 22.—(U.P.)—President Roosevelt today had signed a bill extending until December 31, 1945, the government silver purchasing program's provision that during the war government-owned silver may be sold at 71.11 cents a troy ounce for domestic use.

CHARTER PRINCIPLES STILL VALID—F,D,R,

Washington, Dec. 22.—(U.P.)—President Roosevelt today termed the Atlantic Charter an objective toward world betterment and said that its principles "are as valid today as they were in 1941" when he and Prime Minister Winston Churchill issued it. Mr. Roosevelt was asked at his press conference if he would care

to say something further about the charter in the light of disclosure that it does not exist as a formally signed document.

Chicago, Dec. 22.—(U.P.)—Two passengers were slightly injured when the locomotive and ten sleeping cars of the Santa Fe's eastbound California Limited were derailed today at McCook, Ill., 12 miles southwest of Chicago.

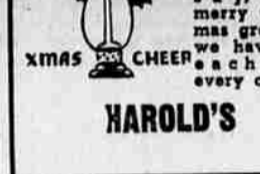

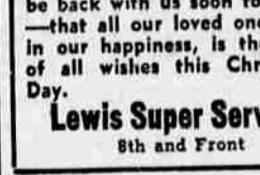

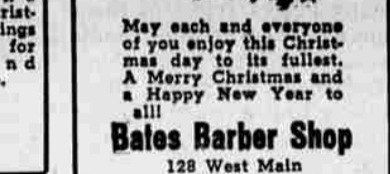
