Portland, Ore., Dec. 28—(U.P.)
—the OPA, in the doghouse
with many housewives and mer-
chants over its Christmas sur-
prise rationing move, today had
a friend in high places—Mayor
Earl Riley of Portland.
The OPA helped the mayor
crack a hard nut in civic purity;
it helped him restore the Port-
land Gypsy community to its
original state of a wandering
tribe.
The mayor long has felt that
the presence of the Gypsies, who
flocked here under the pretext
of becoming war workers, were
a blemish on the fair name of
the city. Taking advantage of re-
laxed housing restrictions, they
moved into vacant stores and set
up their fortune-telling indus-
tries.
Despairing of ousting these
visitors by any other means,
Riley today finally persuaded
the OPA to let the gypsies have
enough gasoline to take them
as far as Texas, though he never
made it clear why the gypsies
should want to go there or why
Texas should want them.

15TH ARMY GROUP TO
BE HEADED BY CLARK
Rome, Dec. 28—(U.P.)—The al-
lied armies in Italy, comprising
the American 5th and the Brit-
ish 8th armies, henceforth will
be known as the 15th army
group. It was announced today.
Designation of the 15th army
group follows appointments of
Lt. Gen. Mark W. Clark as com-
mander of both the 5th and 8th
armies, and indicates that Clark
will concentrate on military af-

When Wells Fail
Oak Lawn, Ill., Dec. 28—(U.P.)
—Oak Lawn's Mayor Al Brandt
admitted today that he hasn't
taken a bath in five days—and
urged every one of the village's
5,724 residents to follow suit.
Furthermore, the mayor warn-
ed Oak Lawn citizens they may
have to go without for 30 days
unless something is done soon
about the acute water shortage.
The No. 1 well has gone com-
pletely dry and the No. 2 well
which normally produces 250
gallons a minute, is trickling at
only a fraction of its normal
flow.
Work has been started to sink
a new shaft in the second well.



186,792 TRUCKS
DUE NEXT YEAR
Washington, Dec. 28—(U.P.)—
The office of Defense transpor-
tation reported today that 186,
792 commercial trucks will be
manufactured next year, only
enough vehicles to meet 25 per
cent of essential civilian needs.
Of the total, 35,704 will be
light trucks, representing about
12 per cent of the estimated de-
mand. Particularly affected by
the light truck shortage, ODT
said, are farmers and dairy pro-
ducers. No light trucks have
been made since Pearl Harbor
and the truck pool set up to
ease the shortage has been ex-
hausted for almost a year.
