

STONE BABY OF NEGRO WOMAN IS TWIN'S PROPERTY

New York, Dec. 30.—(U.P.)—A stone baby, delivered in June, 1940, to a negro woman who has since died, was disclosed today to be the property of its five-year-old sister, Velma Lubin, considered by some doctors to be its twin.

Velma came into possession of the freak, known as a lithopedion, following four years of litigation. Originally when the calcified embryo, almost life-size, was discovered in Mrs. Claudia Lubin's womb along with a normally-dead five months old embryo, Mrs. Lubin signed a release allowing Sydenham hospital authorities to take possession of both bodies.

She discovered later, however, her attorney, Jacob Fishback, said today, that the child was stone, and had been placed in formaldehyde as an exhibit. She then started litigation for \$100,000 damages for mental anguish and the right to bury the child.

Mrs. Lubin died in October, 1941, of a stomach disorder while the case was still pending, and her entire estate, including the calcified body and any damages,

was left to her child Velma, born in January, 1940. Several doctors believed that Velma had been conceived and nurtured in conjunction with a second child—who when not delivered, turned to stone.

Other doctors, including Dr. George J. Berson, who delivered it, believed Mrs. Lubin carried the lithopedion for several years.
