LT. ROBERT ROSE, CITATION WINNER, RETURNS TO DUTY

First Lt. Robert E. Rose, who holds the distinguished flying cross with two oak leaf clusters and the air medal with three oak leaf clusters, left Medford yesterday after spending a holiday leave with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles E. Rose, route 4, box 148. Lt. Rose returned to this country last fall after spending a year in England, where he was assigned to the 44th bombardment group, and in Ireland and Scotland. He is now taking a refresher course at Victorville, Cal.

Awarding of the flying cross and medals resulting from bombing missions over Europe with the lieutenant serving as pilot of a B-24. One citation for the pilot read "for extraordinary achievement over enemy occupied territory March 26, 1944. Lt. Rose's aircraft was severely damaged by enemy anti-aircraft fire over the target, suffering the loss of two engines. Lt. Rose, with superb airmanship and great skill safely returned to friendly territory and landed at his home base without further damage or injury to his crew. The flying ability and sound judgment displayed by Lt. Rose on this occasion reflect the highest credit upon himself and the armed forces of the United States."

Another citation resulted from a bombing mission over Germany March 3 when three engines of the bomber suddenly quit after crossing the channel. "Skillfully controlling his under-powered aircraft, Lt. Rose successfully landed on an emergency field without further damage to his aircraft or crew despite interference on the runway," the second citation reads. The third citation, dated May 17, 1944, read in part, "for extraordinary achievement while serving with distinction as pilot of a B-24 airplane on many heavy bombardment missions over enemy occupied continental Europe. Displaying great courage and skill, Lt. Rose has contributed materially to the successful completion of each of these missions and his actions while engaged in combat with the enemy have been an example for his fellow crewmen."

Lt. Rose has been on active duty since Sept., 1940, leaving Medford with company A of the
