PERSONNEL CHIEF MEETS WITH VET ADVISORY GROUP

Lt. Col. George E. Sandy, chief of veterans personnel from state selective service headquarters at Salem came to Medford yesterday for conferences with the Veterans Advisory committee and other local agencies directly concerned with rehabilitation or reemployment of returned veterans on farms.

This was the first in a series of conferences scheduled by Col. Sandy throughout Oregon. A similar meeting took place in Grants Pass today.

The Veterans Advisory committee, of which Henry Conger is chairman, is organized for the purpose of assisting discharged veterans on farm problems in Jackson county and advising them what can be done with farms acquired under the G.I. bill of rights.
