## News From Jackson County for Men in the Armed Services

Medford high school basketballers jumped into the lead of the southern Oregon conference Friday night when they defeated Ashland 39 to 27 for their seventh consecutive win of the season. They extended this to eight wins the following night with a 39 to 26 victory over Eureka. It was the first set-back for the Loggers, who scored a 40-30 victory over Grants Pass the previous night.

Biggest upset of the local sports picture came when Central Point dumped Grants Pass

46 to 35 Tuesday night. Medford Junior High took the lead in the southern Oregon conference when they defeated Ashland junior high 28 to 17.

This week-end Medford plays Grants Pass there Friday night and here Saturday night while Klamath Falls invades Ashland for two games.

A little rain, a little sunshine and a little fog has been the weather menu for the week with afternoons almost warm enough for spring.

An unofficial census of school

children in the county shows 10,096, an increase of 210 pupils over last year. Chamber of Commerce officials are predicting a slow but steady increase in population and committee heads suggest planning to preserve the county's reputation as a fine residential spot and to expand present industries and recreation facilities.

Littrell Parts will move into a new home about April 1. Conversion of the former Safeway store building at Sixth and Bartlett streets is going on now and another building of the same size will be constructed on the west side of the old structure.

Legislators Earl Newberry, Frank Van Dyke and O. H. Bengtson have gone to Salem for the legislative session, which opened Monday. Herb Grey has been elected president of the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce.

High honors have been given three additional men from this county. Master Sgt. Orville C. Caster, artilleryman, has been awarded the legion of merit for outstanding service as battalion motor sergeant in Italy; Sgt. Wayne White, paratrooper, has been awarded the silver star for heading a patrol which went back of the German lines for vital information, and Pfc. Melvin B. Woods has won the bronze star for making two trips under heavy rifle and machinegun fire to obtain ammunition for his company during the Leyte campaign.

Staff Sgt. Ira David Luman is a member of the carbine shooting championship station team of the 8th AAF in England.

According to Sgt. Gene W. Tedrick, the mud in the European battle sectors is much worse than the famous Jackson county "sticky." The sergeant wrote to say "that good old sticky mud at home is live pavement compared to this." He was recently awarded the combat infantryman's badge.

A dispatch from Italy says that Robert G. Brown, co-pilot of a B-24, has been promoted to first lieutenant and the officer wrote home to say that he had visited the Isle of Capri while on a recent leave, finding it as beautiful as song writers declared. J. F. Richardson of Trail, in England and France for more than two years, has been promoted to lieutenant-colonel. Second Lt. Curtis E. Hopkins is now with the 15th AAF in Italy.

Arriving in this country for hospitalization are Pfc. John Brewer, Lt. Fred Traylor and Pfc. Alfred J. Hardy. Brewer, wounded in Italy in October, is at Barnes in Vancouver and wears the purple heart and combat infantryman's badge. His

brother, Bob Brewer, has been assigned to the infantry and is now at Camp Gordon, Ga. Lt. Traylor, who has been serving with the paratroops in Holland, is in Denver for treatment and Hardy is being temporarily treated at Stark hospital in Charleston, S. C.

Both Pfc. Robert Dallaire and his brother, Cpl. Joe Dallaire, have been here. The latter spent 32 months in Australia and New

Guinea with the 41st division, and Robert, twice wounded during a year's service with the 5th army in Italy, is to return to McCaw hospital in Walla Walla.

Others home from overseas are Capt. Robert Sleeter, also home from the Pacific and 33 months with the 41st; Capt. Kenneth Edwards, who served with the AAF in England and now holds the DFC, presidential citation, air medal and four oak leaf clusters; Capt. Bruce Hammond, USMC; William W. Littrell, MM2c who spent two years in the south Pacific; William Fitzgerald, FC1c, who participated in seven major engagements in the Pacific and goes next to Washington to study radar.

Recently here were Jack Burdell, Rdm3c, home after several months at sea during which his ship was under fire many times, and Lt. Com. Wayne L. Goff who recently returned after eight months service in the Aleutian Islands.

Amazing his friends with a long flowing beard, Alden Hibbert arrived home this week after 14 months duty with the merchant marine in the south Pacific. He holds the Pacific war zone bar and the merchant marine combat bar for participating in action against the enemy in the Halmahera Islands and other places. His brother, Claude, is also in the navy and is at Tacoma, Wash. Cpl. Eldon Chastain, radioman in a joint assault signal company, arrived home this week after 20 months overseas. He participated in battles in Sicily, Italy and Normandy.

A copy of the Italian edition of the Stars and Stripes has been received from Sgt. John C. Anderson and Cpl. William M. Strode wrote to say that he spent Christmas week in Rome.

Jimmy Morrow has been graduated from navigators' school at Hondo, Tex., and commissioned a flight officer while Jerry Vawter has been commissioned a second lieutenant after graduating from Ft. Benning. Both were home on leave. Lt. Vawter ran into a streak of bad luck and was hospitalized twice during his training period for broken bones. He has reported to Ft. McClellan, Ala., as an instructor. Kenneth J. Jones graduated from Ellington Field in Texas as a flight officer and navigator and was home for a time. His brother, Ensign Stanley C. Jones, Jr., is now on duty in the Pacific.

New paratroopers are Cpl. John Neel and Pvt. James F. Harris who completed jump training at Ft. Benning. Dorr Franklin Barrett, who was on Midway island when the December 7 attack was launched and who subsequently was a Honolulu police officer, is now taking marine training at San Diego.
