

C-C COMMITTEES NAMED BY GREY TO SERVE IN '45

Standing committees for the Jackson County Chamber of Commerce were named by the newly-elected president, Herb Grey, at a meeting Friday of the board of directors. In accordance with the chamber's constitution two additional directors were appointed, one, H. B. Murphy being the choice of President Grey and the second, J. E.
