HINDENBURG'S TOMB BLOWN UP BY NAZIS

London, Jan. 24 (U.P.)—Retreating German troops removed the bodies of Field Marshal Paul Von Hindenburg and his wife from their tomb at Tannenberg and blew up the great memorial shrine before abandoning the town to the red army Sunday, the Nazi DNB news agency said today.

DNB said the battle flags of the Prussian regiments that fought at Tannenberg in World War I also were carried away in the retreat.
