HOW COMMON IS SCURVY?

Infants or young children developing scurvy are fretful, anemic, without appetite. They fail to grow and gain weight from week to week. They cry when picked up or moved or handled and sometimes the evident pain and tenderness in the legs makes parents suspect "rheumatism" and the child's instinctive effort to avoid pain by lying motionless may make parents suspect "paralysis".

The gums are of deep purplish color, swollen around the upper central incisors, and they bleed from the slightest irritation or sometimes without evident injury.

Before definite symptoms of scurvy appear (writes Plimmer, a British authority) there is a period of ill health, characterized by certain symptoms which should be looked for in persons who habitually take too little vitamin C, the key to get enough to prevent outright scurvy. These symptoms are a sallow, muddy complexion, loss of energy, fleeting pains in joints and limbs, especially in the legs, usually mistaken for rheumatism. So-called rheumatism in young children has often proved to be actually scurvy.

Hess, an American authority, pointed out how frequently children without showing distinct scurvy symptoms are irritable, lacking in stamina and more or less retarded in growth; and can be restored to better growth, higher stamina and better general health and disposition by the feeding of more orange juice or tomato juice or fresh raw greens of any kind.

I forgot whether it was Hess or McCollum who observed a group of boys in a private school who developed the symptoms above described. The boys passed up fresh fruit in favor of cake, pie, ice cream and the

like as dessert and spent all their spending allowance for candy, hot fudge sundaes and the inevitable carbonated sweetened stimulating beverage which, in my opinion, is bad medicine for any youngster. When the boys were required to take fresh fruit for dessert and fruit juice drinks instead of pop they soon recovered their normal good nature and eagerness to play.

Commander Parry described in the early part of the nineteenth century (Journal of a Voyage for the Discovery of a Northwest Passage) a Seaman Scott's fatal scurvy.

"At the onset of his illness, first thought to be rheumatism, the man showed aversion to motion, lassitude, depression of spirits, pale countenance, fetid breath, livid, spongy, bleeding gums."

Probably they didn't know then what arctic explorer Stefansson proved a century later, namely, that even fresh meat (caribou) or fresh fish eaten raw or fresh-sealed meat eaten raw or only slightly cooked, is a cure for scurvy.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Raw or Par-Bolled?
Your ignorance is displayed by your use of the term "par-bolled" for pasteurized (sic) milk and your untimely to give him advice is shown by your recommendation of raw milk—if it seems strange that a member of your profession (sic) so completely ignores the danger of Malta (undulant) fever from raw milk (A. B. H.).

Answers—Among the things you may learn from Webster's dictionary, Mr. Milkman, is the meaning of par-bolled. For my own home and for infants, children or adults who ask my advice, I prefer grade A raw milk from tuberculin-tested herds to par-bolled, pasteurized—milk in any circumstances any milk at all is perfectly safe for infant, child or adult, if you first scald it—bring it to a boil for one minute.

Raw Meat
Daughter, 4, lives raw ground beef. We let her have it (grade A meat) very hard to digest. (Mrs. R. D.)

Answer—Some risk of infection with the beef tapeworm in the meat happens to be merely contain the larval. Otherwise it is as wholesome, digestible and nourishing as cooked beef.

When Doctors Disagree
