Pleasing Concert Presented In City By Mario Berini

Mario Berini, young American tenor fresh from a recent concert tour in Mexico and South America, was the artist chosen to present the second concert of the 1945 series of the Jackson County Civic Music association Thursday night at the high school auditorium.

Berini pleased his audience with his colorful and beautiful singing. His manner is warm and compelling and he at once establishes a sympathetic relationship with his audience. Perhaps this receptive and non-critical feeling between artist and listeners is more easily established by vocal artists than others because many people enjoy excellent singing of art songs, such as those making up Mr. Berini's program, more than any other type of art. "Where are You Walk", Handel, and the aria "La Fleur que tu m'as jete" from "Carmen" were especially liked, but there were no dull numbers and the Schubert group as well as the modern nationalistic selections were equally enjoyed. Mr. Berini's voice is appealing in quality, and has a wide range. Temperamentally he is able to project intense feeling as well as subtleties of emotion into his program.

The expert and accomplished accompanist was Carl Fuerstner who so ably accompanied Sidor Belarsky, basso cantante, who opened the concert series last season. Mr. Fuerstner was greeted by many old as well as new friends.

Berini's encores were: "Duna" by McGill; "Hills of Home" Fox; "Vienna, City of Dreams", Sczinski, and "Cielito Lindo", Fernandez.

The next concert is this afternoon, at the high school auditorium at 3:00 o'clock and will be presented by the National Operatic Quartet.
