CLOTHING DRIVE FOR RUSSIANS IS OPENED IN CITY

An old clothes drive for Russian War Relief will be conducted this week beginning today, E. H. Hedrick superintendent of schools has announced. In conjunction with a national drive, other agencies cooperating with local schools are the American Legion, the Legion Auxiliary and local churches, Hedrick said.

Citizens of Medford are requested to turn over to school children any items of clothing not needed for a general collection on Wednesday. All articles should be mended and in good repair. Shoes should be paired and tied together so that they can go into immediate use. Winter and summer apparel for all ages is urgently needed, Hedrick said, but should be practical in design. Blankets and bedding are also a relief "must" for the Russians and are wanted on this collection. All contributors are urged to tie clothing in bundles with stout cord.

The drive, which will be organized much as the recent paper drive, has a classroom quota fixed at one pound of clothing per student, with rooms of more than 50 students assigned a 50 pound quota, the school authority announced. Rooms that fall behind on quotas for the paper drive have an opportunity to earn a holiday on this drive by doubling their quotas on old clothes.

30 SKI EXPERTS READY TO FORM PATROL SYSTEM

Approximately 30 men, meeting Sunday afternoon at the Hotel Holland, with L. B. Macnab of Portland, chairman of the Pacific Northwest division of the National Ski Patrol system, expressed a desire to organize a ski patrol for this area. The group will meet Wednesday evening, February 7, at the Chamber of Commerce, to perfect the organization, select officers, and make plans for a training schedule.

Macnab pointed out that Medford was the only area not now covered by such a patrol. Object of the ski patrol is to have a civilian group of men, experienced in mountaineering, and able to travel in the mountains under any conditions, to serve as aids to the military in reaching any plane disaster where there is a chance to save life.
