

PACIFIC COLLEGE PRESIDENT TALKS ON PEACE DRILLS

Declaring that every nation using military conscription as part of its peace time economy has been defeated within the last 50 years, or is about to be defeated, Emmett Gulley, president of Pacific College, Newberg, spoke in Medford Sunday before two church congregations on compulsory military training in peacetime. President Gulley spoke at the Friends church in the morning and in the afternoon at the Brethren church.

"Military conscription has not demonstrated that it guarantees peace among nations," the speaker said. "On the contrary, such practice has led nations into dictatorship and an aggressive military program." Refuting other arguments by those who propose universal military conscription in peace times, President Gulley said that it would not improve the health of the nation's youth and that any proposed national health program should be outside military control.

Speaking on the matter of discipline, the speaker said that real discipline must be self-imposed and that this nation needs more than mere obedience to commands. He further pointed out that labor leaders and educators as well as religious leaders oppose universal conscription.

The speaker closed by advocating that instead of depending upon military might we cultivate mutual understanding with other nations by such practical means as exchange of college students on a large scale, development of the right type of foreign missions and that we develop the attitude of sharing our natural resources with those in need rather than seeking our own national advantage. We should spend millions on promoting real peace measures instead of billions on military training, the president concluded.

Co-Operation Key To Maintain Peace Claims Historian

Ithaca, N. Y., — U.P. — International co-operation is the key to maintenance of future peace, asserts Carl L. Becker,

well-known historian and professor of history emeritus at Cornell.

Becker says that no international police force would be large enough to prevent wars in a world where countries did not co-operate. However, he advances two possible alternatives

for the prevention of war, both of which depend upon international co-operation.

First, the great nations (probably the United States, Great Britain and Russia) could probably partition off the world into spheres of influence, each power responsible for maintaining

peace within its particular sphere.

Second, a super-state could be composed of nations similar to the states within the United States. The super-state could be governed by an inner body of

delegates representing the states which participate.

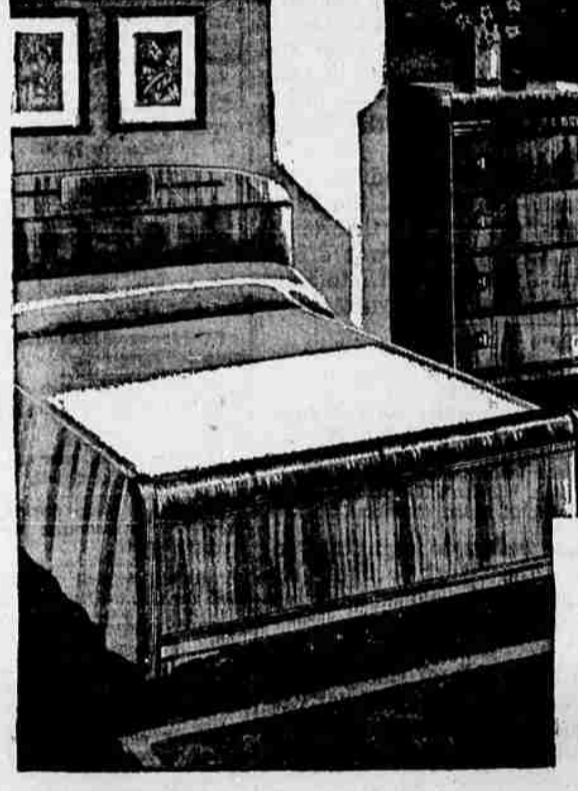

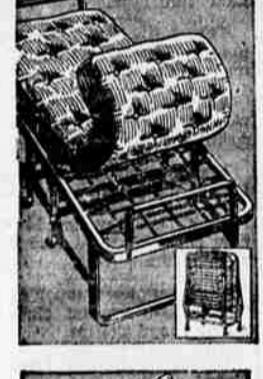

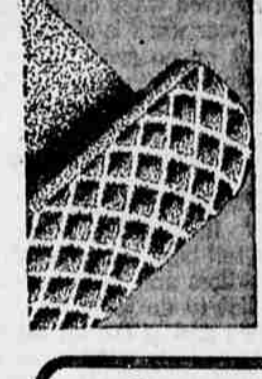
