

'KUM BUM' SEEKS NEW FRAUD TRIAL

Chicago, Feb. 21—(U.P.)—Hugh Greer Carruthers, the "Kum Bum," remained at liberty on \$8,000 bond today pending a hearing March 9 on an appeal for a new trial on a mail fraud conviction.

A federal jury found the former Brooklyn postal clerk guilty yesterday of all 34 counts in an indictment charging him with using the mails to mulct the members of his Neological Foundation of more than \$200,000. He faces a maximum sentence of 162 years in prison and a fine of \$71,000.

Co-defendants Mary Morel, 42, his office manager, and Evelyn Kroell, 32, his secretary, also were convicted in separate ver-

ADVERTISING AIDS U. S. WAR EFFORT

New York, Feb. 21—(U.P.)—War effort advertising in United States newspapers totalled \$9,733,880 in November, bringing to \$47,385,457 the total for the first 11 months of 1944, the bureau of advertising of the American Newspaper Publishers association announced today.

War bond advertising, including all six war loan advertising from Nov. 1 to Dec. 16, headed the list with \$5,051,380 or 75 per cent of the total.

Of the 11-month total, exclusive of war bond advertising, \$22,678,590 was paid advertising and \$2,519,657 donated by newspapers.

YANKS RECAPTURE ITALIAN MOUNTAIN

Rome, Feb. 21—(U.P.)—American troops of the 5th army, storming up precipitous terrain against strong German resistance, recaptured 5,000-foot Mount Belvedere dominating the entrance to the Pararo River valley, headquarters announced today.

The advance was aided by artillery fire and strong air support. The sector is about 30 miles southwest of Bologna.

The peak had been in German hands since November when a German counterattack pushed back the doughboys' four days after they occupied it.

GOVERNMENT SPENDING GROWING LIKE CAMEL

Los Angeles, Feb. 21—(U.P.)—Taxpayers should attack militantly the "cancerous growth of government spending," John W. Hanes of New York, chairman of the Citizens National committee, today told the 19th annual meeting of the California Taxpayers association.

"Make yourself heard in Washington," he advised. "Once the war is over, it is perfectly possible for a courageous congress to begin promptly to cut taxes. Under a decent business

administration, the individual income tax can be reduced by 50 per cent—corporate taxes can be cut in half."

Gloria Vanderbilt Inherits Fortune

New York, Feb. 21—(U.P.)—Gloria Vanderbilt Di Cicco came of age today and into her own—\$4,438,000.

Her legacy came through her father, Reginald Vanderbilt. It was one of the largest chunks of one of America's great fortunes—the railroad wealth amassed by Cornelius Vanderbilt in the last century.

ITALY AND FRANCE TO SIGN PACT, IS BELIEF

Paris, Feb. 21—(U.P.)—Authoritative sources said today that France and Italy would sign an agreement within two weeks renewing diplomatic relations between the two countries.

Italy broke relations with France in June, 1940, with a "stab in the back" declaration of war while French armies were reeling under a German blitzkrieg in the northeast.

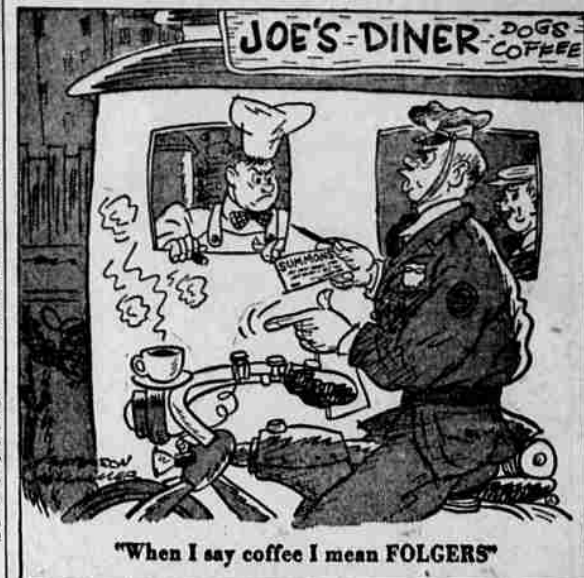
YOUNG FOLK REMINDED TO FILE TAX RETURNS
