Rogue River, Talent, Central Point and Jacksonville survived first round play in the Jackson-Josephine county class "B" basketball tournament underway at Medford high school gymnasium. Yesterday afternoon Rogue River walked over Eagle Point to the tune of 29 to 16 and Talent edged Butte Falls 30 to 26. In evening play Central Point had little trouble beating Prospect 27 to 11 and Jacksonville turned back Kerby, only 23 to 19. In semi-final rounds tonight Central Point meets Jacksonville at 7:30 o'clock and Rogue River collides with Talent at 8:30. Saturday night the losers play for third place, beginning at 7:30, and the winners meet for the championship, slated to start at 8:30. First place teams will then meet winners of a Klamath-Lake counties tournament for championship of district five.
