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HOITY-TOITY

I am 20, healthy, strong, do expect this will make the hoity-toity ladies as mad as Marseilles to be a nurse but would like to be a nurse but have only two years of high school. Is there a chance for me to study nursing anywhere? (S. L.)

I have always wanted to be a nurse, but I lack the educational requirements for enrollment in nurse training school. What about home-study courses by mail, to fit me for employment as a physician's office assistant or as a nurse's aid in some institution? (Mrs. H. W. M.)

Answer—If and/or when the hoity-toity people in charge of the racket decide to admit to nurse training school young women with one or two years of high school, and to complete their training as nurses in a two-year course, it might be a calling worth a girl's while. As things stand now I'd advise girls to avoid nursing. I suggest that Mrs. H. W. M. apply now to physicians in her community for the job she would like. Incidentally—though this does not interest the hoity-toity folk—not ten per cent of pupils or graduates of nurse training schools can write letters that reflect better education than the letters of S. L. and Mrs. H. W. M. do. Mere diplomas and grades or marks given by temperamental or whimsical teachers carry far too much weight, and common sense too little, with the hoity-toity nurse training school authorities. If you ask me, girls, I advise you not to listen to that phony appeal for recruits to the nurse training racket. Good nurses are needed in the services, all right, but that is the unanswerable reason why the absurdly high requirements for admission to nurse training should be relaxed or rather placed on a reasonable level.
